Mr. Lombardo has been a thought leader in EHR technologies since the late 1980's. As a co-founder of Streamline Health Solutions, Inc. in 1989 he was a pioneer of early Electronic Medical Record (EMR) adoption and later led his company to be the first vendor to offer the creation and access of electronic patient records from an affordable Software as a Service (SaaS) delivery platform.

Starting with only three employees, Streamline Health Solutions experienced tremendous and consistent growth as an early EMR vendor during its first seven years, moving through all the growth stages from start-up, to venture funding, and on to a successful IPO. The proceeds of the IPO allowed the company to pioneer SaaS delivery of health records and to create an entire set of applications that were designed to automate provider business offices with respect to Revenue Cycle Management (RCM). Streamline Health's leadership position in the EMR and RCM sectors led to successful implementations at some of the most prestigious healthcare institutions in the country including:
